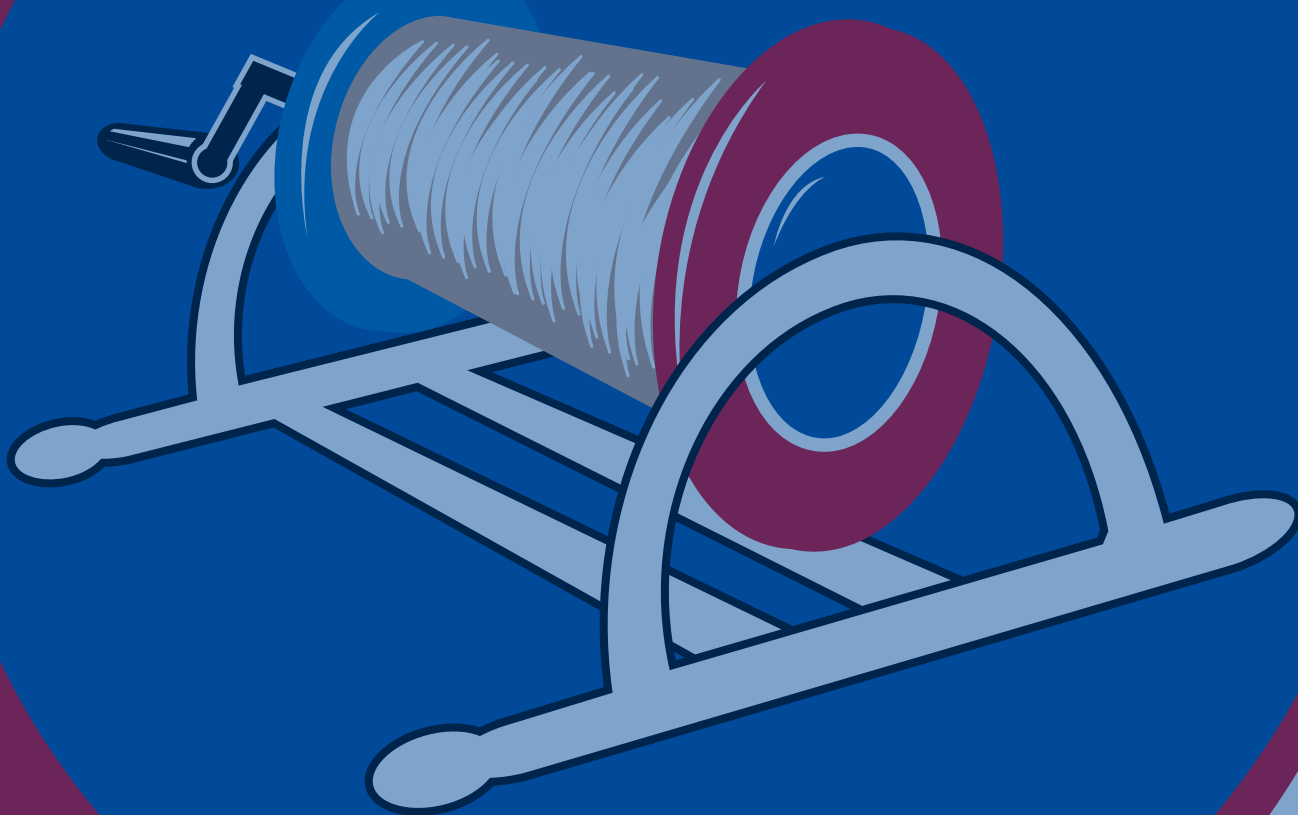

This season we had over 80 qualified patrolling members, more than 40 senior competitors at the Victorian state champs at Portland and, for the second time ever, members compete at the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships at Kurrawa, Queensland. At Kurrawa, Hannah Linehan came third in the U15 Girls 2km beach run, our first medal at the Australian Titles! We also had 6 members represent the Victorian Pool Life Saving Team; Lauren Hannaker, Ben Hannaker, Felicity Harrison, Lisa Ferguson, Courtney Stuenberg and James Evans. Many medals were received by all competitors for both individual and team events and Ben and Felicity were also selected for the U16 Australian team. There were 12 junior members who were selected in the Victorian Beach Life Saving Victorian team. We also had our first team to compete in the Life Saving Victoria Patrol competition, the open team finishing 3<sup>rd</sup>, the U19 team coming 1<sup>st</sup> as well as many individual placings. Finally there was the 4<sup>th</sup> placing overall by the seniors at the Victorian Life Saving Championships at Portland. What more can we say! With successes in all areas of the club, we keep getting bigger and better.

The club is expanding, and improving in all areas. It takes a lot of people to train these patrolling members and competitors, run them around and organise and manage these teams. I would like to thank the following people for their efforts through out the season – Michael Barbarino, Grant Rattenbury, Richard Bedford, Rob Tennant, Winston Burger, George Crilley, Stuart Hamill, Greg Rankin and Mitch Hannaker.
