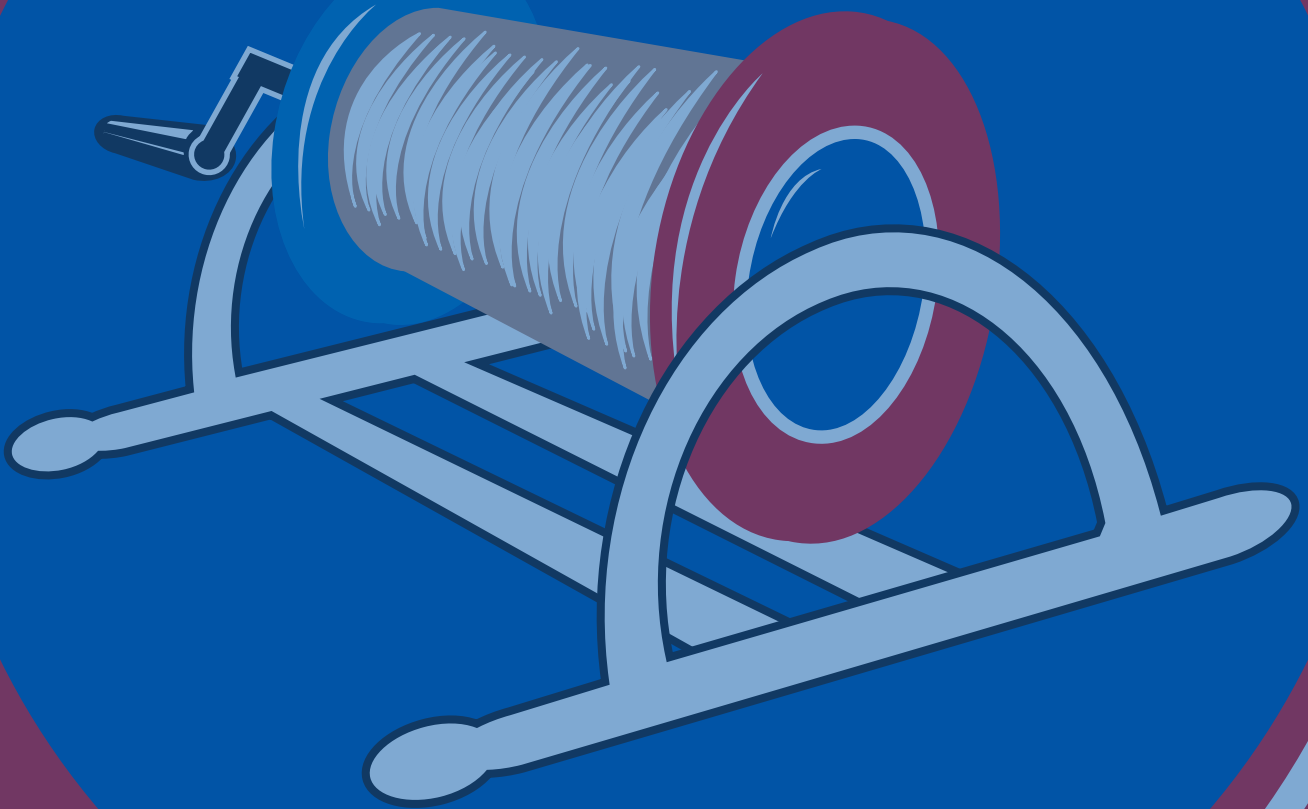

This season we had qualified over 100 patrolling members, which is at the highest it has ever been for decades, we had 30 senior competitors at the Victorian state champs at Apollo Bay, we also had members compete at the Australian titles at Scarborough, Western Australia, and Hannah Linehan outdoing herself and last years performance with a second placing in the U17 Girls 2km beach run. Mordialloc had 6 members represent the Victorian Pool Life Saving Team, Lauren Hannaker, Ben Hannaker, Troy Earle, Lisa Ferguson, and James Evans, with Ben making the U16 Australian team, and James appointed Coach with Mitch Hannaker as the team manager. The Junior Barras won the Pool Life Saving Competition in Darwin at the Arafura Games held in May, so well done to those involved there. There were also the 3 juniors members who were picked in the Victorian Beach Life Saving Victorian team. Then there was the 6th placing by the seniors at Apollo Bay, with numerous wins and places by competitors. A special mention to Dean Saunders and Shane Hamill, who did not lose the board rescue event all year, well done guys. What more can we say! With successes in all areas of the club, we keep getting bigger and better. We had our two patrol inspections this year and lost a total of 150 points, which was our best result in years also.

The Mordialloc Life Saving Club keeps expanding, and getting bigger and better in all areas, it takes a lot of people to train these patrolling members and competitors, run them around and organise, manage these teams. Junior Report

This was the same colour as used at carnivals and made organising age groups a lot easier because each junior knew what flag to look out for. Each group also had there own plastic tub with attendance sheets and equipment required to run each age group.

Over 100 juniors signed up with their families for training which was fantastic. Not all of them were on the beach together but most trainings had at least 70 juniors. A very encouraging group of juniors. Skill levels vary but I would hope each junior finished the season with something different they had done or achieved and also had fun along the way.

Like most sports, we rely on volunteers to help. We were very fortunate this year to have a great number of age managers who were happy to help. We had 10 people become accredited with Life Saving Victoria with age group manager certificates. This means the people taking the age groups are dedicated enough to do training courses. Remember they are all volunteers.

The carnivals were well attended and some good results were achieved. It was great to see that even though they did not always get a place, the Mordy team would always give it a go. I have a lot of satisfaction watching juniors who have not done any life saving activities before the season, go out and give some of the other clubs a good run for their money.

The Thursday night board training has been very popular and the improvement of our juniors on the boards has been noticed by parents and other competitors. The after training meals and drinks on the deck have also proved to be popular. Thank you to the helpers and organisers of this night. On a warm night watching the sunset there is no better view.
