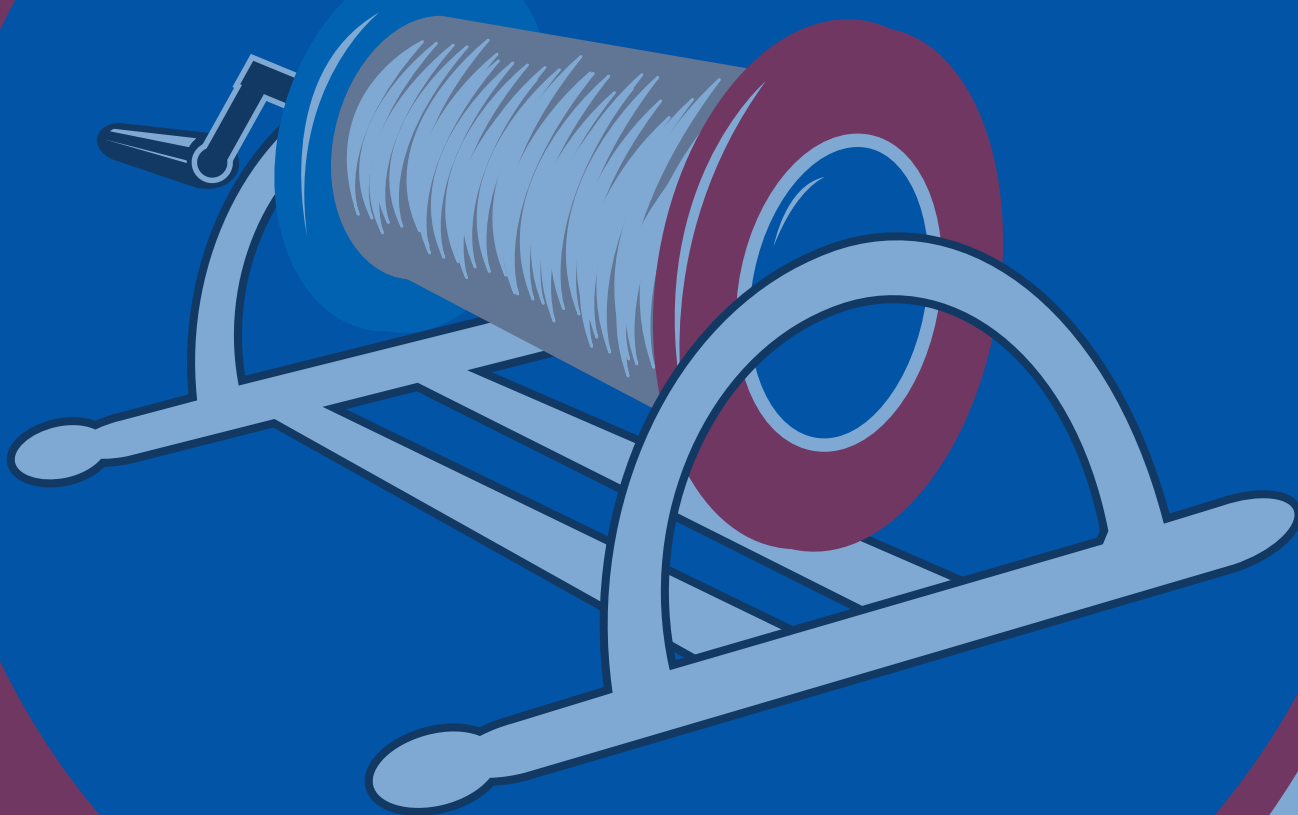



We had 45 senior competitors at the Victorian state champs at Jan Juc, we also had 12 members compete at the Australian titles at Scarborough, Western Australia, Richard Bedford, Jessica Silvester, Alexandra Rowe, Georgia Rowe, Michael Moldavonu, Josh Heatly, Tom Hurst, Shane Hamill, Harry Peirce, Dean Saunders, Sienna Fogarty and Jemimah Lam. With Mordialloc making 11 finals and Jemimah finishing 4th in the U15 Beach flags, which was an excellent effort.

We also had Sienna Fogarty, Harry Pierce, Jemimah Lam and Jess Silvester who represented Victoria in the Junior state team with Jemimah winning the Flags at this competition which shows we have great depth in our club.

For the 1st time this year we had 2 boat crews compete at the Vic's, and for the girls, being their first competition at Jan Juc, what a welcome it was with 8 foot surf! It was great to see both boys and girls crew battling it out in the surf, and to Rob for his efforts as the sweep of both the crews, well done guys.

Mordialloc also had members represent the Victorian Pool Life Saving Team, Harry Peirce, Jemimah Lam, Bianca Robinson, Kim Stewart, Ben Hannaker, Michael Hamill, Felicity Harrison, Troy Earle, Lisa Ferguson, and James Evans, which was over half the team. Victoria Finished 3rd overall by only 8 points to Queensland. Harry Pierce competed in the U14 and U16 age group, and won the U14 Age group overall, the first by a Victorian U14 at the National level. Mordialloc also had members make the Australian U19 Team – Felicity Harrison and Ben Hannaker, with James Evans selected as the Australian U19 coach.

What more can we say! With successes in all areas of the club, we keep getting bigger and better. We had our two patrol inspections this year and lost a total of 100 points, which was our best result in years also.

The Mordialloc Life Saving Club keeps expanding, and getting bigger and better in all areas, it takes a lot of people to train these patrolling members and competitors, run them around and organise, manage these teams. 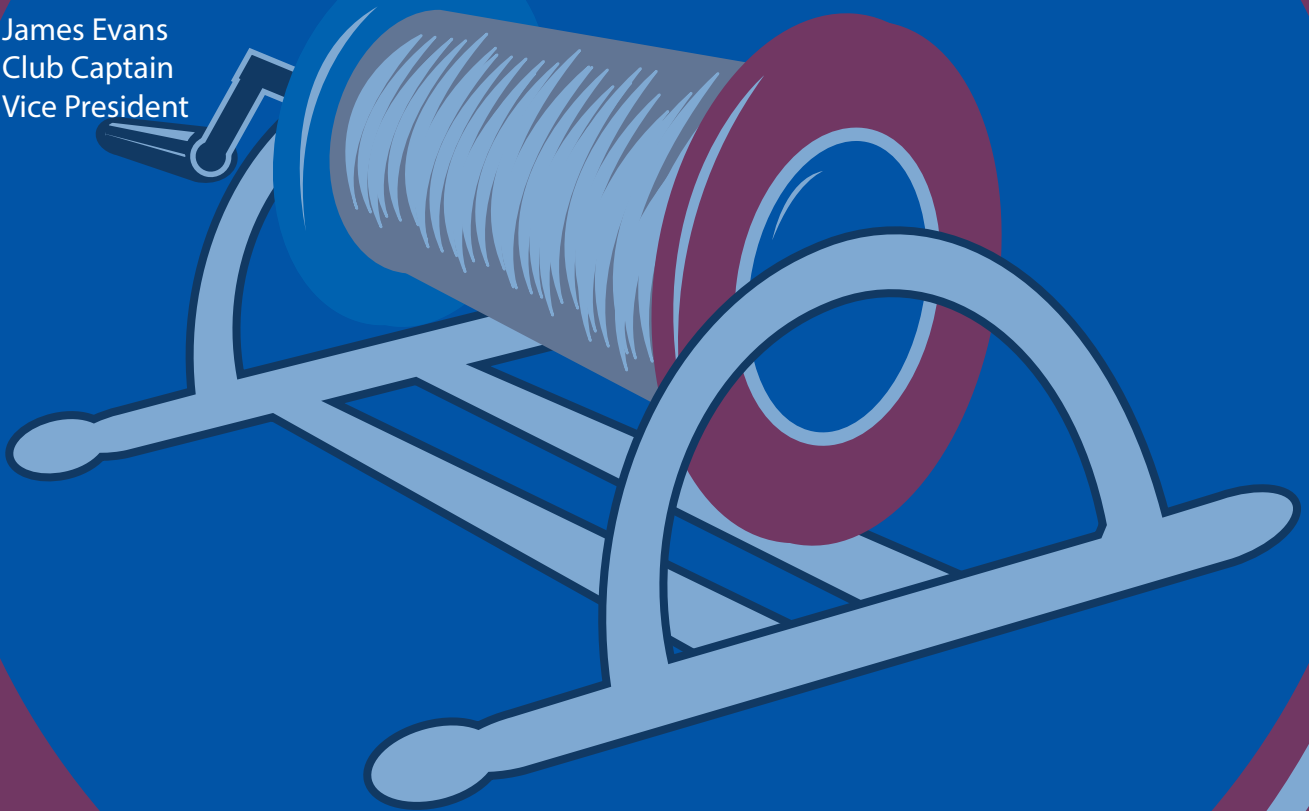
Tuesday session as well as the Thursday one.

Junior Report

Training started for junior lifesaving on October 23rd 2007 with a registration day. Thanks to the membership team and other committee members, the day was a well organised event. Membership Report

It was a great season this past year, with a total of 453 active members (up from 382 last year). Nipper numbers were also up with 137 Nippers training and competing up from 102 in 2006-2007. Thanks to those who promoted the Club and assisted in attracting new members to Mordialloc LSC.

There was a big increase in qualified patrol members this year, going up from just over 70 in 2006-2007 to 118 this season. This was due to further recruiting of young seniors and many nipper parents qualifying for their Bronze Medallion award.

A quick summary of membership types is as follows

- o Family Membership - 105 families (up from 80 in 2006-2007)
- o Individual Membership – 85 individuals (up from 67 in 2006-2007)
- o Life membership – 16 individuals (15 last year)
