Lifesaving operations involves the training of lifesaving qualifications to provide qualified volunteer lifesavers to patrol our beach. Once again, we have had a very successful season running four Bronze Medallion Camps, which produced over 50 new Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate holders. These camps are a huge time commitment and only possible through the hard work of volunteers to organise and run them, particularly Jesse Hamill our Chief Instructor. We finished the season with over 145 active volunteer patrol members, which certainly helps more evenly share the responsibility of providing weekend patrols through summer.

It is fantastic to see the club growing, but whilst this reduces the strain in some areas it increases the work involved in managing and cost of running our Lifesaving Services. Also to the rest of the Executive committee who work tirelessly, whose support of each other is second to none, Rob with his superb secretarial skills, Michelle and her "Fort Knox" approach on our funds keeping our heads well above water and Michael "Bubba" Barbarino with his control of the awards and patrols within the club.

And to the rest of the committee who also work tirelessly to keep our club going forward, with Jill and the great job she has done with the nippers, Robyn and Sue on the hall hire, Simon on the Building, Kaye and Julie with the Clothing, Guy with the bar and fund raising, Judy with the awesome job she does with sponsorship and grants, Richie and Jesse with patrols and award training.
